We attract third-party funding from public research funding programs as well as from public authorities and industry partners. UniBw M particularly encourages the acquisition of funding from the German Research Foundation (DFG) and the European Union. Our sponsoring institution, the Federal Ministry of Defense, provides outstanding research conditions through excellent infrastructure and equipment and is also an important source of third-party funding.

Through the collaboration of its seven university faculties and its three faculties within the University of Applied Sciences sector, UniBw M covers the entire spectrum from basic research to application-oriented research. The broad range of disciplines represented at our faculties enables research on current challenges across a wide variety of topics, including beyond disciplinary boundaries. By bringing together diverse perspectives, we open up innovative fields of research, as exemplified by our guiding theme **“Security and Resilience in Technology and Society”**.

We are committed to developing strong research profiles and have established interdisciplinary research centers (INDOR, MARC, MORE, RISK, SENS, SMADH, and SPACE) as well as the research institutes CODE and CISS. Alongside internal collaboration, we regard external networking as essential for addressing complex research questions. Therefore, UniBw M places great importance on cooperation with other universities, research institutions, industry, and public administration at both the national and international levels. Our research results should be made as accessible as possible to industry, policymakers, society, and the Bundeswehr. For this reason, we actively support our researchers in transferring their findings into practice, commercializing innovations in cooperation with industry, and pursuing entrepreneurial and start-up activities.
