

Studies at the University of the German Federal Armed Forces in Munich

Answers to frequently asked questions

I want to study with you, how do I do that?

Since we are a university of the German Federal Armed Forces, we mainly study officer candidates and officers as well as - in a smaller number - civilian students. In order to study at our university, you need the general university entrance qualification (Abitur) or the Fachhochschulreife (Fachabitur). Applications are submitted via the Assessment Centre for Managers of the German Armed Forces. The candidates and Candidates are invited to Cologne for a 2.5-day examination at the Assessment Centre for Managers of the German Armed Forces. After tests, exercises and interviews, the best candidates for the officer's career are selected here. Studying at one of the universities of the Bundeswehr is an integral part of officer training with a commitment period of 13 years.

In some courses it is also possible for civilian students to study at the University of the German Federal Armed Forces in Munich, provided there are free capacities. An industrial company pays the tuition fees. Applications go directly through the faculties.

Is studying with you very military?

Most of the students at our university organise their studies themselves. They choose the lectures they want to attend and also determine their own learning rhythm. They are no different from their fellow students at the state universities. During their studies, students are also free to choose whether they want to wear a civilian or uniform. Since our students are also soldiers, however, they regularly complete a small military program during their studies. This consists, for example, of a walk and a shooting exercise during the quarter.
